What a fantastic start to Year One we have made. We are busy every day enjoying learning in many different ways. Here are a selection of some of our favourite activities.

Gymnastics on a Tuesday is always great fun learning about balance, control and co-ordination. The equipment is fantastic!

Our current topic is *Toys From The Past.* A big thank you to all parents and grandparents for letting us experience their wonderful and precious old toys. It has been truly educationally valuable to see them. We are really looking forward to our school field trip on Wednesday I 5th November to Stranger's Hall in Norwich for our *Toys from the Past* workshop.

As scientists we have made predictions and observed the results of our experiments carefully in our *Water* topic. We are also starting to see the importance of fair testing in order to get accurate findings. So far we have explored the water cycle and created freezing and evaporation experiments.

The Rainbow Fish by Marcus Pfister has been our main literacy book this term. The Year One children have been practising their story telling skills and writing sentences using a word bank and sentence starters. We are now writing our own picture storybooks.

We have been practising counting skills and representing numbers in different ways. Place value is our next challenge where we recognise that numbers below 100 are made up of digits which are represented in tens and units.

In French, we have been learning about the parts of the body.
