Pedagogical Ponderings.

A slightly uncomfortable topic for Pedagogical Ponderings this week, but a topic that is equally important and necessary to share, both from a professional and personal point of view.

In recent times, there has been a lot of media coverage about the increasing number of cases whereby tech devices have been used inappropriately by young people. This could be, for example: cyber bullying (using a mobile device to bully someone), questionable relationships stemming from social media, and or sending selfies or texts with age-inappropriate content. I read a headline in the New Zealand Herald (NZ's leading newspaper) this week which said that there was an increasing number of cases being reported to police and social services about boys as young as eight taking such photographs and plastering these over social media. It is something that we must continue to address. If you stop and consider it though, how easy is it for young people to do this? These days, it's almost unheard of for a teenager to not have a mobile phone. Not being on Facebook is risking social isolation.

Scaremongering? I sincerely think we need to be aware of what our young people have access to. Despite the fact that our Henstead pupils are still very young and innocent, it won't be long until they find themselves in an environment where exposure to this will be unceasing.

What are we doing about it at The Old School Henstead? Firstly, we review and update our policies and practices in online safety as part of the Safeguarding of the children in our care. We are making changes to the computing curriculum that is delivered, in particular to the Upper School. We want to have more of an on-going focus on e-safety in order to best protect our pupils with early intervention and teaching. Thus the boundaries between natural curiosity and staying safe are clarified.

Finally and most importantly, we need to work on this with you. Parents (and parental control settings on devices) have the most important role to play in esafety as it's at home where easier and more continual access to technology is found. If you're concerned about your child's use of technology at any time, please feel free to talk with us.
