Ecological Studies Field Trip.









On Monday the Year 2 boys and girls visited Ringsfield Hall Eco Centre. The aim of the eco-centre is to reconnect people with themselves, with others and with our planet.

In line with our Science topic of materials, the children had the opportunity to use all their senses exploring the extensive grounds at Ringsfield. Despite being chilly, the children's enthusiasm for experiencing and enjoying nature clearly prevailed. After a day of poetry, exploration, and reflection, their efforts were rewarded with a chance to make bread and popcorn over a camp-fire.

The children's senses and creativity were reflected in a rather lovely poem written with the help of Mr Hunter;

"Looking at the tree, it is beautiful.

It has been particularly enjoyable observing the children as they develop their investigation skills and experience new situations as they reflect on their learning and use this in their play.

We are showing fantastic 'having a go' attitudes as the expectation for reading, writing and mathematical understanding increases. We are now demonstrating active learning as we concentrate and keep on trying when we encounter difficulties.

It is always lovely to see the children enjoying their own achievements, especially in the weekly spelling tests, daily reading and phonics lessons.

Our current focus on creating and thinking critically has been challenged through our learning about cold lands. Children have been able to develop their own ideas about colder climates, make links between our animals and those in cold lands, and develop strategies when making their sock penguins.

CROSS COUNTRY

On a bitterly cold Friday morning fourteen Old School Henstead runners braved the conditions at Finborough School for an Independent Schools Association annual regional cross country event.

Up first on the 2.1 kilometre course were the Year 4 boys and girls. First home for the girls was Isobel in an impressive 22nd position, followed by Isabelle and Kitty in 32nd/33rd place.

For the boys, needing a top ten finish to reach the national finals later in the year, Francis finished 11th as he was just pipped to the line, with Marli, Harry S and Caleb all coming in close order, gaining valuable experience and showing real promise for years to come. Years 5 and 6 found themselves mixed together so it made the competition even harder for the younger competitors. Kate was first home with a 16th placed finish, followed by Emily 47th, Daisy 57th and Rosie 70th.

Last up were the boys, who found the terrain tough, with fields, roads and woodland to work their way through. Louis lead them home coming in 57th position, Thomas 63rd and Harry B 82nd.

A fantastic effort by all pupils as there was a strong field of 120 runners in each race.
