## Dígging up our Anglo Saxon past













Year Three's intrepid archaeologists set off for Sutton Hoo in bright sunshine and things only got better. After a smooth drive to the famous site at Woodbridge we were greeted by Tony the volunteer guide - as close to a living Anglo Saxon as we are likely to get. Our first session was a walk to the burial mounds, with much fascinating detail on the Anglo Saxon settlement of Britain being exchanged. Our team made a good impression with their understanding of why the legions left Britannia and how the first Anglo Saxon army arrived. On 'Mound Number One' we laid King Jasper of the Henstead Saxons to rest, while Tony explained how Tudor grave robbers missed the greatest Dark Ages treasure in Western Europe and how it was discovered in 1939.

Then it was off to hone our practical archaeological skills in the centre's sand boxes. We



carefully dug and mapped our finds in the gridded areas and then convened to have an authentic archaeological controversy over what they were - a cow's hip bone or the prow of a ship?

After a picnic and run around we returned to the visitors' centre where volunteer lane took us to the reconstructed burial chamber with its fabulous replica treasures laid out around the king. We dressed in Anglo Saxon costume and played who's inside the helmet, absorbing a wealth of impressions of our extraordinary ancestors. The play area was top notch too! ### **Eggcellent news from Nursery**


