In swimming we continue to learn the skill of breath control. This is the first step in learning to swim independently. We are now a lot more confident at submerging our face in the water and blowing bubbles. We are developing a fast and strong arm motion that will eventually support us to swim with speed and control.

Dinosaurs have been the focus of all our literacy and maths lessons this week and has been observed in the children's free flow learning too. Letter formation and sentence writing independently is being practised. We continue to revisit our digraph and tricky words through fun games on the interactive white board.

On Thursday Reception escorted Nursery on a Jurassic Journey adventure back in time to when dinosaurs ruled the earth. We experienced impressive installations of animated dinosaurs with electronic moving parts and lots of other interesting and interactive displays. The dinosaurs really do come to life! We had close encounters with a life-like stegosaurus, a velociraptor and the king of them all, a tyrannosaurus rex. We now consider ourselves palaeontologists and as part of our training, we took part in a scavenger hunt digging for fossils with Prof. Possilfossil.

And as if the day could not get any better, we received a surprise visit on our return to school from Lady Heidi Crick, who brought in one of her lambs that had been born only a few hours earlier in the day.

Our children are natural scientists. They are curious, ask questions, they predict outcomes and put their theories to the test. This was clearly demonstrated this week when they tried to break fruit out of ice blocks. Firstly they tried to smash the fruit out with their feet, then they used sticks and tools and eventually came up with the idea of using water from the tap. The ice didn't melt quickly enough for them, so they asked for warm water.

Water play is a passion in our Early Years so Miss Butcher tapped into this and led an activity around "floating and sinking". The children enjoyed finding objects, testing them in the water, discussing why they floated or sunk and even recorded their findings on clipboards.

There has been lots more mark making this week. The children have been painting murals on the fence, chalking on the black paper, painting their favourite dinosaurs and writing words to describe dinosaurs.

Dinosaurs has been the main theme for small world play this week and for stories and maths at carpet time, as we prepared for our trip to *Jurassic Journey* at the end of the week. (See Page 2)
