








House Art Competition.





The culmination of a busy half term for the Houses went on display in the Hall this very week. They had been given the design brief of the school values for this half of term - Confidence and Creativity; the entries certainly demonstrated plenty of both, showing a wide range of skills, techniques and media to express their theme.

For Orwell, it was a complete Lego panorama, set off by some colourful backdrops. Every Duck had contributed to the piece and it was a pleasing tableau.

Perhaps inspired by the success of Year Four English earlier in the term, Waveney has all created individually decorated letters to produce a giant acrostic poem, expanding on the values of the Owls to striking (knowledge into wisdom) and sizeable effect.

Yare had tackled the slopes, gullies and summit of Yaredonia through the medium of wire sculpture encased in papier mâché, with each Yare bear ascending in pipe cleaner form to the pinnacles of confidence and creativity.
