#### Year 6 Transition Week

For the pupils of Year 6 the move to their new school is rapidly approaching. Paradoxically, the one thing that never changes about life is change: change cannot be controlled, change just happens. Whilst we can't prepare for every change our Year 6 pupils will encounter, we can guide them on their way to dealing with change itself.

During preparation for this transitional period we focus on beliefs, knowledge and interpretation. Not only will these affect how our young fledglings feel about transition, but also outcomes. During Transition Week a variety of discussion and activities have taken place. We have thought about staying safe, rights and responsibilities, led and supported younger members of the school. First Aid training led by Dr M Hardman provided an excellent grounding in the basics of response and assistance should they ever find themselves in a situation where their help could make an important difference.

As senior school pupils, Year 6 will experience the real world. They will need to manage their own perceptions and reactions. Looking forward positively and with excitement about what's coming up, underpins our transition preparation. Pupils are encouraged to be open about their feelings, they know that change means they lose something too. Old teachers, old friends, and an old school building will be left behind. However, to be temporarily sad is testament to the success of the Henstead journey.

## Doyouthinkhesaurus?









Year I and Year 6 had a fantastic day out together at *Roarr! Dinosaur Adventure Park*. The aim of the trip for the Year 6 children was to develop their leadership skills with younger children during their transition week. They were partnered up with a Year I child and were responsible for holding their hands, reading difficult words and general acts of kindness. The aim for the Year I children was to experience the dimensions and identify characteristics of different dinosaurs.

Following the dinosaur trail, we explored the woods and released our inner dinosaurs. We came face to face with life-sized dinosaurs, both big, like the Brachiosaurus, and small, like the Raptors.

Spotting the camouflaged Tyrannosaurus Rex resulted with excited squeals and frantic gesticulating. "Do you think he saw us?"

On the dinosaur trail the children collected stamps from the following dinosaur exhibits: Woolly Mammoth, Ankylosaurus, Triceratops, Brachiosaurus, Pterodactyl and a variety of field stations.

The Year 6 thoroughly deserved their dinosaur medals for exploring and surviving *Roarr! Dinosaur Adventure Park* with their Year I buddies.

After lunch we visited the fossil centre and discovered a range of ammonites and dinosaur bones whilst digging and brushing in the soft sand. Next we headed to the indoor play area to escape the torrential rain.

On the journey back to school, the previous excitement and energy of the Year I children had metamorphosised to calmness and sleep. Year 6 returned to school completely exhausted but happy after their Jurassic trip of responsibility. What a great day! A big thank you goes out to Year 6 from Year I. *Mrs Loader*
