We are teaming up with the Soul Foundation charity (in partnership with Norwich City Football Club), who run the largest food bank for our region, delivering thousands of boxes of food every week to families in need in the area. They have already delivered 1 million food boxes. Demand has risen as a result of the recent lockdown and job losses, and we would like our small school to make a big difference to families facing difficult times. Therefore, instead of asking families to donate one item per child, we

would be hugely grateful if you would consider donating several items or a bag of groceries, so that we may fill the charity's van, which will be with us on the day. No need to worry about the weight of items, as they may be dropped off at the gate.

We have been asked to donate only nonperishable items, such as any tinned goods, pasta, coffee, tea, cereals, biscuits and other treats.

We thank you for your generosity in advance. The charity has told us that there are families reaching out to them, and who are referred by social services, as they literally do no know where their next meal will come from. Please help us make a difference and bring your donations










Natural Art
