
### Jeans for Genes

### Nursery News



This week our children have been enjoying a variety of maths activities and number work. Mrs Suffolk visits twice a week and we all sing counting, action songs using her props for adding one more and taking one away. The photos show the 10 balancing elephants and the classic 5 little ducks. During their free play sessions the children are naturally drawn to the maths areas, they use the coloured beads for sorting by size, shape and colour and for counting how many they can thread on the stick. The children are always asking for the very popular numicon resource which they use to create number bonds to 10, counting and comparing quantities and making shapes. This week Madam Dakin introduced the story of Owl Babies which we used to reinforce the number 3 and what that means as well as comparing sizes. We have been also been using our lunch routine as another opportunity for maths. The children count how many for hot lunch, count the correct amount of plates and seats and even count out how many pieces of fruit and vegetables. The children in Early Years Foundation Stage are well on their way to becoming super mathematicians in the future.
