#### Oh I do Like to be Beside the Seaside.











This gives the illusion of volume and dimensionality to their sketches.


The children have also been working with water colour pencils and paints, the latter medium allowing them to play with the intensity of the hues, making some almost transparent and others much deeper and bolder.

## Reception Writers.












This week, the children in Reception have been really enjoying their writing activities! They've been learning lots of new tricky words (words that can't be sounded out!) and getting to grips with several new Phase 3 sounds. Well done Reception! - Miss Doughty











It has been another fabulous week for Year Two. I am impressed by the progress they have made this year so far and am enjoying every single week with them.

You may have heard stories about a 'wanted' dragon around the school recently. There was much excitement from all year groups when wanted posters went up around the school. The children created descriptive posters complete with expanded noun phrases and a range of subordinating and coordinating conjunctions to attempt to capture a dragon. Equal enthusiasm and effort has been applied to our maths lessons this week, where the children have been doubling and halving numbers. They have applied their knowledge of the two times table and addition to help tackle the challenges set for them this week. I would like to mention here how the children partitioned larger numbers into tens and ones to help them - Minty even managed to find halves of three digit numbers! Furthermore, the confidence the children have shown has allowed them to look at fractions. They have used their knowledge of equal sharing to split numbers into halves, quarters and thirds. ### Calculations.









This week, we worked to consolidate their understanding of 2D shapes, with a lesson series focussing on how to calculate the area of both compound and noncompound shapes. With adroit usage of times table facts, the pupils were able to undertake the challenge of first finding out the length of the sides, and then to multiply them together. As the pupils transitioned towards compound shapes, where the sides of the lengths is not as obvious, the pupils' ability in finding out the lengths by using the available information was excellent.

Their work, both independent and in groups, was of a top class, and well deserving of the praise received. - Mr Hunt


