
Year One delighted us with their wonderful assembly performance on Ancient Egypt.


We were entertained by a Pharaoh, pyramid builders, archaeologists, Howard Carter and even a caveman!

A1's all round. Very well done!
















Do you believe in Bog Babies?






School Notices
