Nursery Expansion

Some exciting news, our Early Years department is expanding! Due to increasing pupil numbers, we will be expanding our Early Years learning space over the course of the summer holidays. The plan is to include a new walkway and garden entrance to the current Year 2 classroom, expanding our learning spaces for our Early Years children. The new Reception cohort will use this as their classroom for phonics, maths and other more formal carpet sessions, providing the nursery children with 2 learning spaces for their own taught sessions.

We are pleased to report our continuous provision set-up has been kindly celebrated by a number of visiting experts and professionals, providing children with an excellent, child-led approach to independent exploration and learning through play. All Early Years children will have access to this space to continue reinforcing and developing all areas of learning within the Early Years curriculum, with the added bonus of now being able to provide three spaces for taught sessions.

The Year Two classroom will be moving into the next block, currently used as our learning support classroom.
