Competition Corner



Year Five and Six

Our new science topic is about electricity and circuits. This week, pupils discussed the two types of electricity - static and current.

Over the course of six experiments, they investigated the power of static electricity to find out how it's created and how it behaves under certain conditions. Each experiment involved the time-honoured way to create static electricity - rubbing a balloon on their heads (or some fabric)! The boys and girls discovered that static electricity can separate salt and pepper by polarising each substance, and that simply by holding a 'charged' balloon over small pieces of paper, that paper flies up and sticks to the balloon. It was like magic! They were also rather surprised to find out that different parts of our brains use electricity to communicate with each other. Who knew we had electricity inside our own bodies!


