Junior School - Mrs Dakin's Class

The children have really enjoyed exploring our science topic on Ocean Animals. This week we focused on seahorses. We discovered that a baby seahorse is called a 'fry', and that seahorses can range in size from just 2cm to 35cm! To complement this learning the children created their own unique and beautifully designed seahorses.

On Monday some very excited children set out on a trip to Southwold Lighthouse-and what a day it was!

Our guide welcomed us and shared the incredible story of this amazing landmark! Built from 300,000 Victorian bricks, the lighthouse stands proudly at 31metres tall. We were a little out of breath as we climbed all 113 steps to the top. We learnt that the lighthouse first shone its light in 1890, originally powered by six oil wicks. It was automated in 1938 and now its powerful beam

reaches an impressive 27 miles out to sea. One fun fact we discovered, every lighthouse is referred to as 'she'! It was a day of fun, learning and unforgettable views.


















Senior School - Mrs Braidwood's Class

plunge pool to cool off.




















Henstead Hike
