# Senior School - Mrs Braidwood's Class

The boys and girls had great fun in science this week exploring the fascinating world of reaction times. Using nothing more than a ruler and a sharp pair of reflexes, pupils worked in pairs to test how quickly they could respond to a falling object. One person held the ruler vertically, while their partner waited - eyes focused and hands ready - to catch it as soon as it was released.

There was plenty of laughter, a few surprised faces and even some friendly competition as the class discovered how small differences in distance could reveal big differences in reaction speed. This simple but effective experiment was a brilliant way to bring science to life, helping pupils understand how our nervous system works, and just how

fast (or slow!) our brains and bodies can respond.
