Welcome back! Our classroom is alive again with laughter, energy and ideas! We've launched into our new topic all about 'Gravity'. This week we became scientists ourselves and explored the effect gravity has on everyday objects-using a spinner and paper clips to see the force in action. In Maths, we've been learning greater than, less than and equal to using their special symbols-can you remember them? We explored how numbers can be represented in different ways using ten sticks and ones. Then we compared numbers to see which were greater, less, or equal. Try this at home.















Senior School - Mrs Braidwood's Class

The children in years three and four have thrown themselves into life at Henstead. They have been doing so much great work that it made it difficult to choose the pictures to include in this week's newsletter! In English, we have been exploring figurative language, and the children created this incredible piece of shared writing about the character in the story we are reading:

"Late at night, Heather decided while her parents were asleep, that she would run away from home. Minutes felt like hours, as Heather was walking through the woods. Silver and shiny the moon lit up the path, Heather decided to follow. Blurry and unidentifiable shapes flew past Heather as she took off her glasses. Near the cotton rock Heather saw the bright moon. Cautiously stepping, the smell of wet dog and sap guided her along and the strong smell of condensation knocked her off track. Walking slowly along the path, she felt as scared as a newborn bird, her hands were quivering in fright."

In Humanities, we have been learning all about Life in Ancient Egypt. The children were amazed when we realised just how long ago the Egyptian civilisation began and have been animatedly discussing what life could be like using clues that have been left behind. I was impressed by the comparisons between life today and life then.

In art, our topic is 'portrait of a place'. The children spent a lesson capturing multiple mini sketches of the areas of our school that they felt drawn to. They paid great attention to the details and are capturing increasingly realistic representations of the world that surrounds them.

Senior School - Mrs Sonn's Class

Exploring the Titanic - This half-term, our class has embarked on an exciting new topic in English: the Titanic disaster. We began by imagining what it would have been like to first glimpse the magnificent ship at Southampton Docks, ready to board with all the crowds, luggage, and excitement of the day. We've also been learning about the different accommodation on board for 1st, 2nd and 3rd class passengers, and what life would have been like for each of them.

One of the most staggering facts we uncovered was the sheer size of the Titanic. At 269 metres long, it's hard to picture just how vast that really is. To help us, we took a measuring wheel and set off from school along the road to Raven's Farm. To our amazement, we discovered that the ship would have stretched around two-thirds of the way there — the length of three football fields! Seeing this distance for ourselves truly brought home the scale of the Titanic and has fired up our imaginations. This sense of awe will certainly inspire the children's writing as we continue to explore the fascinating and tragic story of the ship that was thought to be 'unsinkable', over the weeks ahead.

At the end of the summer term, we were delighted to welcome back two of our former pupils, Olivia and Charlotte, for a week of work experience. Their contributions were hugely valuable, and they quickly became part of daily life at the school, offering support and enthusiasm in every task.

They also enjoyed meeting today's pupils and seeing school life through their eyes.




















Archery


