Reception



History Takes Flight!

What a day to remember! Our pupils enjoyed an action-packed and inspiring visit to the Norfolk and Suffolk Aviation Museum, where history truly came to life.

The adventure began aboard one of the museum's historic aircraft, where we discovered what air travel was like before the war. Sitting inside the cabin and imagining passengers from another era made the experience feel wonderfully real. Pupils then had the chance to try on wartime gas masks, gaining a powerful sense of what life was like for people on the home front.

We also learned about the extraordinary bravery of those who flew during the war, especially the rear gunners who spent up to eight hours confined in a tiny turret, high above enemy territory. The courage, endurance and teamwork required left us all in awe.

After an exciting morning, we enjoyed lunch in the NAAFI canteen, before taking to the skies ourselves, this time in flight simulators! Pupils loved the challenge of taking off, flying and landing safely, with some surprisingly skilled pilots among the group.

The afternoon brought another unforgettable experience when we found ourselves caught in an air raid during the Blitz. Everyone hurried into an Anderson shelter, where we learned how families passed the time until it was safe to emerge. Finally, the pupils became wartime evacuees, discovering what life was like for children sent to the countryside during the war.

Many thanks to the museum's fantastic volunteers, who were full of knowledge, passion and enthusiasm. By the end of the visit, the pupils had learned so much - not just about aviation, but about courage, resilience and life during wartime. It was truly a super day, and several of the children agreed it was the best school trip they've ever been on!































Cooking up Creativity

Our Senior pupils have been busy this week working on a brilliant Food and Nutrition project: creating a recipe designed for a specific type of person. Using iPads and the Eatwell Guide, they researched nutritional needs, dietary preferences and portion planning before working together to design their own unique dishes. Each team developed a recipe tailored to their chosen individual from athletes to busy parents - and carefully budgeted ingredients to ensure their meals were both balanced and cost-effective. The planning and teamwork on display were excellent, and pupils showed great creativity in their menu designs. We can't wait to see their culinary creations brought to life after the half-term break, when they'll head into the kitchen to cook their recipes for real!





KS2 DT Project

Over the past few weeks, the children in KS2 have been working on a group DT project. They received a brief that asked them to design a family-friendly new rollercoaster to pitch to the new owners of Pleasurewood Hills. Each team had to design a unique rollercoaster with a clear visual identity and then make a model, poster and speech about why their design should be chosen.

Team 1 - Designed an exciting aquatic-themed rollercoaster called 'Under Life' where riders would board bubble-shaped carriages in groups of four to soar through thrilling loops and dips on a cobalt coloured track that even zooms through an aquarium tunnel with live animals for you to see. To quote their speech, "this coaster is certain to fulfil your needs for drops, thrills and terrain so beautiful".

Team 2 - Designed an autumnal-themed rollercoaster that combines cosiness and gentle thrills called 'The Cosy Express'. Riders of this coaster would board long trains (shaped like sausage dogs) and nestle down into luxurious cushions before gliding around an undulating track that included a fairy-lit, leaf-strewn tunnel. The USP of this coaster was that riders could purchase a delicious fall-themed beverage to enjoy on their journey.









Team 3 - Designed a thrilling rollercoaster where riders could choose how fast they would spin by selecting one of the Sanrio characters, aptly named 'Spinning Sanrio'. On a stilted pink and purple track featuring death-defying loops and enormous drops, small spinning carriages would seat up to five riders as they twirled along with speeds up to 50mph. This coaster has its very own merch shop where riders can buy Sanrio accessories to remember their day.

As always, the children's creativity and passion blow me away. I don't think there is a single ride that I wouldn't want to try from this collection. Well done!
