
Junior School - Mrs Dakin's Class


This week we are learning the 'ea' spelling

pattern. We are practicing writing words with 'ea' and using them in our own sentences.



Senior School - Mrs Sonn's Class

History in Focus: World War Two

This half-term, the pupils have been delving into one of the most significant periods of modern history – World War Two. We began by exploring the causes of the war, and the children were introduced to a new word: appearement. They enjoyed discussing what this meant and how it shaped events in the late 1930s.

We'll also be exploring what life was like on the Home Front, including the Blitz, rationing and the experiences of childevacuees. The pupils will also have the chance to explore wartime propaganda posters, thinking about how messages were communicated to the public and how people were encouraged to stay positive in very challenging times.

It has been wonderful to see how engaged and curious they are, asking thoughtful questions and making links between the past and the present. We're also looking forward to our trip next Tuesday to Norfolk and Suffolk Aviation Museum in Flixton, where we'll learn more about the experience of children living in East Anglia during the war.









Science

Some of our pupils have been gathering and exploring soil in science, testing its texture, composition and how well it holds water, to see how it affects plant growth.
