The children had a fantastic start to the week as they celebrated World Science Day with a fun "Will It Float or Sink?" experiment on Monday, predicting and testing how different objects will behave in the water. They also explored colour through mixing paints in the tuff tray, experimenting with shades and predicting what new colours will be made. Towards the end of the week, we enjoyed a range of Pudsey-themed activities for Children in Need, including baking and decorating Pudsey biscuits, creating their own colourful Pudsey masks, and taking part in finger-painting activities that supported the development of their fine motor skills. 




















### Reception

Last week was all about bonfire and fireworks night!

In Maths the pupils have been practising their adding and subtracting skills using bead strings and showing fantastic counting.

#### **Testing Our Reflexes**

The pupils became scientists as they explored how quick their reflexes are. Working in pairs, one held a ruler while the other had to catch it as quickly as possible when it was dropped - no touching it early!

They recorded their results to see who had the fastest reactions and thought about what might affect how quickly we respond. The activity led to some brilliant discussions as pupils discovered just how amazing - and sometimes surprising - our bodies can be.
















### Senior School - Mrs Sonn's Class

This week, pupils discovered how the Vikings used science to make their food last longer, and they even had a go at making their own butter. Using jam jars and double cream, the children shook their mixtures until the butterfat and buttermilk separated. After sieving, washing and adding a pinch of salt, they wrapped their homemade butter, ready to chill. There was lots of vigorous shaking (and tired arms!) as pupils took turns to churn, and everyone was amazed by how a simple ingredient could turn into something so delicious. It was a brilliant, hands-on way to bring science, history and food technology together


## Music Lessons with Mrs George-Broom
