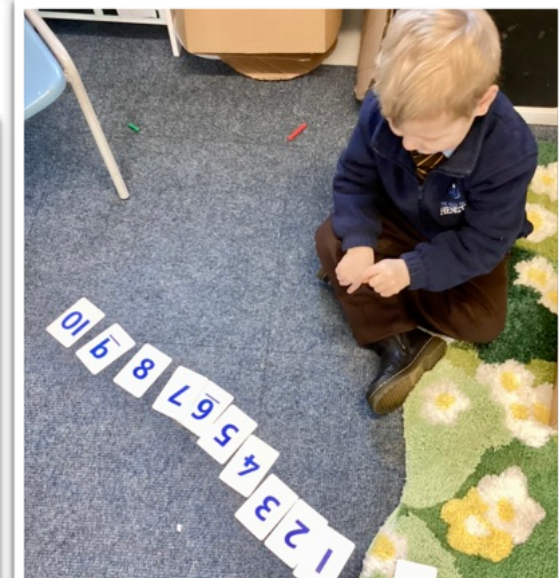




## *Mrs Webster's Class*

## *Junior School - Mrs Dakin's Class*

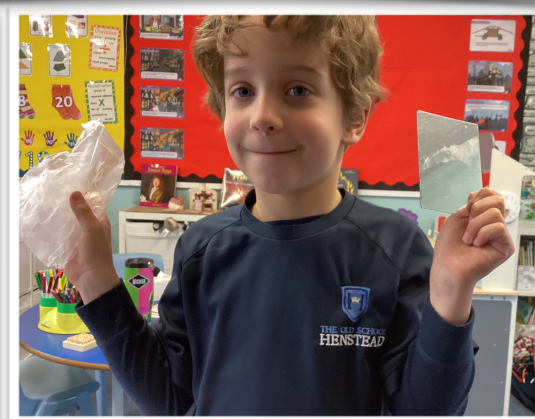
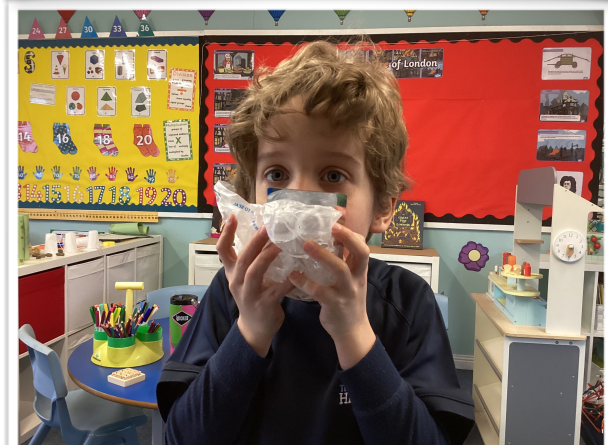
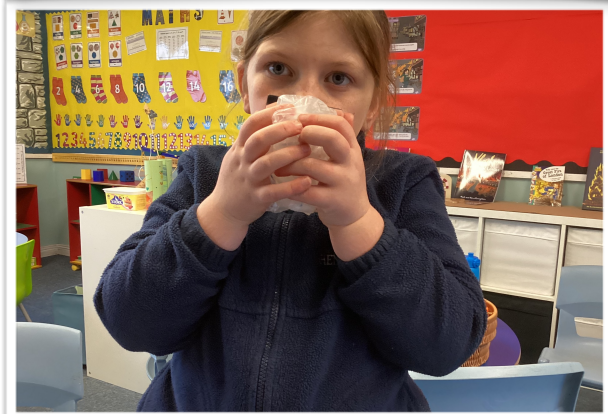
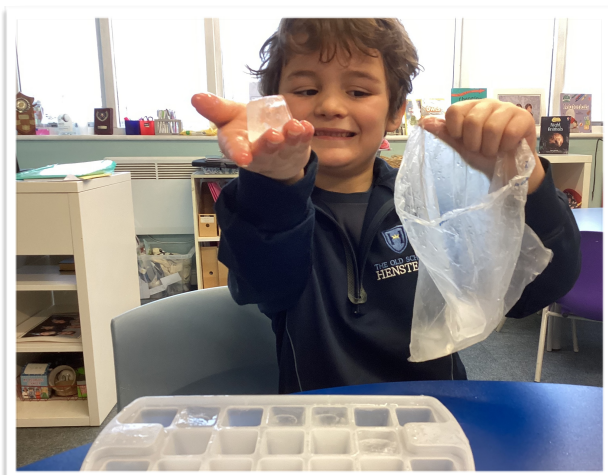
This week in science, the children investigated why breath is easier to see on a cold mirror than a warm one. We began by asking, 'what do you think will happen when you breathe on the mirror?' and made predictions together.

Using ice cubes, we cooled one mirror while keeping another warm. The pupils breathed onto both and compared how long each mirror stayed misty. We discovered that the cold mirror stayed misty for longer.

We learned that our breath contains water vapour, and when it touches a cold surface it turns into tiny water droplets. This investigation helped us understand how temperature affects what we can see, and introduced the children to the scientific idea of condensation.

They loved investigating, predicting and explaining their ideas like real scientists.
